Education Directory for Children of Military Families with Special Needs

The Department of Defense has developed the Education Directory for Children with Special Needs, which provides military families with children with special needs the information they need to make informed assignment decisions and easier transitions. The directory consists of two components:

- The Early Intervention Directory focusing on early intervention services for children birth through 3 years old.
- The School-Age Directory focusing on education services for children with special needs, 3 through 21 years old.

The Early Intervention Directory summarizes national and state level early intervention trends and includes descriptions of local early intervention service providers. The School-Age Directory summarizes national and state level trends for special education and includes descriptions of individual school districts.
